MINISTER'S MESSAGE



Redeeming The Time

Life is brief. Our lives are short in comparison to all of time and especially in comparison to eternity. Moses would write in Psalm 90:10, "The days of our lives are seventy years; And if by reason of strength they are eighty years, Yet their boast is only labor and sorrow; For it is soon cut off, and we fly away." When James would speak about how we ought not to assume that we have any time beyond the present, he would say, "For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away." (Jas. 4:14)

When considering the brevity of life, the proceeding thought should be obvious. How are we spending the time that God *has* given us? Think about your daily routine and all of the hours that go wasted on non-consequential things. I have strong doubts that many of us will reach the end of our lives and regret not spending enough time scrolling through our Facebook feed or watching TV. On the other hand, I would hope that each of us gets to the end of our lives content with the number of souls that we reached with the gospel, the time we spent studying the Word of God, and the times that we assembled with the saints to worship God in spirit and truth. If we are lacking in any of these areas, it is *high time* to be "redeeming the time, because the days are evil" (Eph. 5:16).
